Dear Property Owner:

The Ohio Department of Transportation intends to improve portions of US 250 by adding turn lanes, sidewalks, and other related features in Erie County approximately from US Route 6 to Bogart Road to provide improved facilities to better serve the needs of the traveling public. In connection with design studies it is necessary to do certain survey and environmental work and to perform soil drilling operations in order to properly determine soil properties.

As part of the environmental studies, all areas that may be considered as historic or containing archaeologically important materials must be identified and located. The location of these sites must be reported to the State of Ohio Historic Preservation Office prior to starting any design and actual work. This coordination with the State Preservation Office is for the assessment of any potential impacts to these identified sites. If you are aware of any such sites within the proposed projects limits, please inform Mac Vance of our Office of Environmental Staff and provide him with the suspected site location. He can be reached at 1-800-276-4188.

The actual construction is not scheduled at this time but is anticipated to begin in the spring of **2015**. The final design and right of way features will not be known for quite some time, but it is possible that your property could be affected.

Accordingly, we wish to advise you that it may be necessary for our work crews or crews from private consultants hired by this Agency to enter upon your property to obtain certain field data needed in connection with this improvement. Sections 5517.01 and 163.03 of the Ohio Revised Code authorize such entries but also require that reimbursement be made for any actual damage resulting from such work. All crews have received strict instructions concerning the preservation of private property and public lands. In the event that any valuable vegetation must be cleared in order to accomplish our work, you will be so notified and informed as to the procedure to follow in preparing a claim for reimbursement. In all cases, however, removal of vegetation as well as other damage will be held to a minimum. If at any time you feel that our representatives have not given proper attention to private property, please notify this office at the above address.
