Fiscal Officer Comments

- Payments for the period of June 22nd – July 4th totaled \$\$797,253.21. This includes payments to Rumpke for the dumpsters used at Clean Up Day, Best Equipment for repairs and maintenance to Public Works Equipment, Premier Home Professional for Community Development Grant work, Strawser Construction for crack sealing and micro surfacing, and PROTX Tactical for police vests.
- Motel Tax for the month of May totaled \$119,216.81, bringing the Township up to \$498,162.24 for the year. With the difference YTD being down by only .07% the next few summer months will be more telling on whether we will bring in more revenue than last year.
